1st verse: **H**is foundations are in the holy mountains; the Lord loveth the gates of Sion more than all the dwellings of Jacob. (*Psalm 86:1-2*) "*And it brought to Thee Magi...*"

2nd verse: **G**lorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. I will make mention of Raab and Babylon to them that know me. (*86:2-3*) "*And it brought to Thee Magi...*"

3rd verse: **A**nd lo, the foreigners and Tyre and the people of the Ethiopians, these were born there. (*86:4*) "*And it brought to Thee Magi...*"

4th verse: **A** man will say: Mother Sion; and: That man was born in her; and: The Most High Himself hath founded her. (*86:5*) "*And it brought to Thee Magi...*"

5th verse: **T**he Lord shall tell it in the writ of the peoples and the princes, even these that were born in her. How joyous are all they that have their habitation in Thee. (*86:6-7*) "*And it brought to Thee Magi...*"

5th verse: **H**oliness becometh Thy house, O Lord, unto length of days. (*92:7b*) "*Thou hast led Magi to worship Thee...*"
